2009 BOARD OF DIRECTOR ELECTIONS

The annual election of members for the Board of Directors was held recently. Ballots were sent out on October 16th and returned ballots were tallied at the November 18th Board of Directors meeting. There were eight candidates on the ballot for the nine board positions. There were also a number of write-in votes.

As a result of the tally, the eight members of the 2009 Board of Directors will be: John Bills, Roy Chadwick, Rich Dobner, Lloyd Grant, Todd Harris, Dave Klenske, Josh Lamour, and Ed Sharpe. The ninth board member was not decided at the meeting. There were a number of write-in candidates. These will be contacted to determine who will accept their nomination. This process was in-progress at the time of this writing.

Officers will be selected at the January board meeting. Thank you to all association members who cast their votes. Thank you also to the board members for volunteering.

The board is responsible for oversight of facility maintenance, supervision of employees, and financial planning and tracking. Board members participate in a monthly meeting and may spend a modest amount of time outside of the meeting.

Being a board member is a great way to get involved and make a valuable contribution to the Belwood community. No experience is necessary. TREASURER'S REPORT

The year is rapidly coming to a close, and board business is winding down. We have an approved 2009 budget that has been distributed to all members, and are looking forward to next year. As you are aware, the global economic crisis is affecting us all. We have been customers of Downey Savings for many years, but given the growing reserve funds, the board decided to add to where we are investing our funds. While the FDIC insurance limit has been temporarily raised to \$250,000, that is set to expire in about a year and we did not want to risk losing any homeowner funds. Therefore, we have switched some accounts over to Bank of America in order to stay within the old FDIC limits. We will continue to monitor the situation and make the best decisions for the homeowners.

My 2008 priorities as treasurer were:

- Change from cash flow to accrual based accounting- Mandated by state law- COMPLETED
- Intelligently invest annual operating funds in CDs to maximize investment return- COMPLETED
- Have books audited by independent accounting firm as required by our By-Laws- COMPLETED

We have achieved them all, ensuring legal compliance and protection of your assets. On an accrual basis, our October 2008 YTD income statement is solid. We have an income of nearly \$170K against budget of about \$160K for the year. Likewise, expenses are about \$111k vs \$124K forecast, showing a net income of about \$58K vs. \$34K. We will be making some pool repairs in the next month or so, which were planned for in the reserve study (although the life expectancy was shorter than expected, we did plan for this expense at some point), and reserve funds will be used to for this expense.

We are wrapping up another strong year financially. If you have ANY questions, I encourage you to come to a board meeting or contact me directly.

NEW TRAILS JOIN THE BLOSSOM HILL SYSTEM

Some who have been reading the Bellringer may recall my trail guides for the Belgatos/Santa Rosa/Heintz complex right in our back yards a few years back. This time I will describe some trails that opened just last spring. Time constraints will prevent me from adding a map this time, though.

This new Oak Ridge/Rocky Ridge trail system starts at the top of the hill where Harwood ends and carries on down the other (south) side of Blossom Hill to Shannon Road. The trails were developed by Greenbriar Homes as a part of the Shannon Ranch development at Shannon Road & Hicks. Unfortunately, parking on Shannon Road is very limited. On the other hand, Belgatos neighbors don't need to drive to get there, since the trails are just past the end of Harwood.

To get to this system take Harwood to the very top. There is a gate at the top of the road with a walkway around the side. Don't worry, this is a public access, whether it looks like it or not. When you get to Santa Rosa Road you will go around a second gate. The gated section is a fire access from Harwood to Santa Rosa.

Cross the *cul de sac* to reach the Oak Ridge trailhead, a gate in a chain-link fence. It's all downhill from here, and the whole Oak Ridge trail is about 0.4 miles. This is the south face of the hill, and like so many other hills in the Bay Area, all the forests are on the north-facing hillsides and the south-facing hillsides are grassy. This means that you will have wide open views of the valley below, and the hills further to the south that constitute the Sierra Azul Open Space.

After a about 1/3rd of a mile and a handful of switchbacks there's a fork in the trail. The yet-unnamed spur to the right traipses a level half mile across the hillside to a point that will eventually connect to the trail that parallels the uphill segment of Santa Rosa, where it reconnects with Belgatos. Since all the easements have not been agreed upon, it's a dead end for the time being, but it is a very pretty walk offering a lot of solitude, and it cuts through a steep forested area. You're not all that far from home, but it's likely that your cell phone won't work here.

If you choose to go downhill rather than to take the spur, you will reach the end of Oak Ridge where it intersects with the Rocky Ridge Trail. Here you can either double-back to the left or go right. The path to the right takes you about a half mile over a wooden bridge, up a hill in the woods, then down a steep path near a horse ranch to a stream. It ends in the small parking lot on Shannon Road, very near Hicks. The path to the left at the Oak Ridge/Rocky Ridge intersection takes you 1/3rd of a mile behind the Shannon Ranch development and along its side to Hicks Road. Although you can walk along the street from the end of Rocky Ridge trail at Hicks to its other end at Shannon there are parts where there is no sidewalk and the cars pass pretty quickly, so take care!

Those familiar with the trail system may want to find other ways to get to the trailhead perhaps by approaching Santa Rosa from the top of the Belgatos Trail or from the trail that leads from Harwood to Madera Court.

The Oak Rige and Rocky Ridge trails are a fun hike, but have a pretty good incline, so take your time and enjoy the outdoors!
